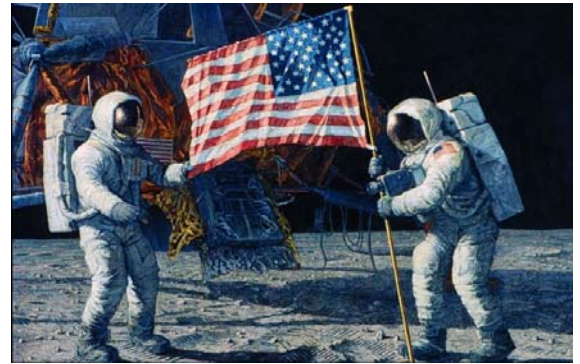


Apollo Program

On the left, painting titled "An American Success Story". He painted John Young during Apollo 16 after narrowly aborting their moon landing due to double failures of the steering system.



On the right, painting titled "For One Priceless Moment ...". This was the first line from President Nixon in a telephone call during Apollo 11 after posting the flag. He continued to say "... in the whole history of man, all the people on this Earth are truly one; one in their pride in what you have done, and one in our prayers that you will return safely to Earth."

Astronauts (left to right) Gus Grissom, Ed White, and Roger Chaffee, pose in front of Launch Complex 34 which is housing their Saturn 1 launch vehicle. The astronauts died ten days later in a fire on the launch pad on Jan. 27, 1967, when a flash fire swept through the Apollo 1 command module during a launch rehearsal test.



Earthrise is the name given to a photograph of the Earth that was taken by astronaut William Anders in 1968 during the Apollo 8 mission. It was declared by professional photographers as "The most influential environmental photograph ever taken."

This photo would later become synonymous with humankind's venture into space.
